Project Description:

Project will delivery is scheduled to occur during school holiday period **commencing 8th April and concluding on 17th April**. Sessions will be held at **Forest Hill School of Arts Hall**.

Project sessions offer **free** opportunity to learn, explore and develop artistic and cultural skills and knowledge. Presented on an informal basis to promote a welcoming, safe, non-judgemental space where attendees have choice to participate or observe activities.

To broaden arts and culture skills, knowledge, creativity and appreciation guest facilitators / artists to attend sessions to cover specific skill / styles / cultures example: Indigenous culture and musical equipment, Bass guitar, Singing, Drumming, Keyboard, Microphone technique, Song writing etc. Sessions will be catered offering refreshments and nourishment for participants.
